The ments to the building. The Goodridge Forward plan was not developed in a vacuum — it is the culmination of over a year of assessments, planning, prioritization, community feedback, and more. The school board and administration feel confident that the proposed plan best addresses posed plan best addresses the district's most critical needs while providing a high value for district taxpayers. If residents approve the \$21.35 million single-ques-tion ballot, these improve-

ments will positively impact students, staff, and the community for decades to come, including: right-sized Providing

spaces to educate students, including Special Education, history, classrooms to serve grades 3-6, an improved science lab and lecture area, home economics, and more. Providing hands-on learning spaces, such as welding, spaces, such as welding small engines, welding, robotics, and more will open doors of possibilities for stu-dents that choose not to attend postsecondary education.

• Creating right-sized spaces for physical education and activities, including adequate gymnasium space. The new gymnasium would provide space for locker rooms, concessions, and a rooms, concessions, and a weight room with commu nity access, and the small gymnasium would be renovated to serve as a dedicated secure entrance. Making critical updates to improve safety, security, bathrooms, and building

systems, including a dedicated secure entrance, improving the building's HVAC systems to increase indoor systems to increase indoor air quality, and providing additional bathrooms to serve students well.
