

# REFERENDUM FAST FACTS

Vote on or before Tuesday, November 7.

At Goodridge Public School, we are committed to our students and their successful futures. On <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>November 7</u>, residents of Goodridge Public School will decide whether to invest \$21.35 million into making critical improvements to address our facility and educational needs. **Visit GoodridgeForward.org for more information!** 



### **OUR CHALLENGES**

Our school requires key facility and educational updates.

- Our school's building systems are inadequate, outdated, or beyond their useful life including a single steam boiler, limited ventilation, temperature controls, plumbing systems, and more.
- We lack the proper number of restrooms across our various levels, making it difficult for students to use them during pass times.
- We lack a dedicated, secure entrance, and the district office is currently located on the second floor and needs to be relocated for adequate supervision and monitoring.
- Areas not originally intented to serve as learning spaces are being used, particularly for Special Education.
- Several classrooms and areas are undersized and do not meet the Minnesota Department of Education's recommended guidelines.
- Our current shop area is undersized, only allowing space for woodwork.
- Our existing gymnasiums are undersized and no longer meet our district's needs.



A single-question plan to invest in key facility and educational needs.

#### **CRITICAL FACILITY UPDATES**

- Install a new boiler system, temperature controls, and other system replacements.
- Create a dedicated, secure entrance and relocate the district office.
- Implement various critical bathroom updates and build additional restrooms.
- Create a corridor from the elevator to the main hallway.

#### **IMPROVED AND ADDITIONAL SPACE**

- Create an expanded area to support Career and Technical Education (CTE).
- Build a six-classroom addition to house students in grades 3-6 and provide space for Special Education and flexible collaboration.
- Build a full-size gymnasium to support physical education and athletics along with locker rooms, concessions, and a new weight room.
- Improve and right-size spaces including our science classrooms, elementary classrooms, and more.





- Providing adequately-sized spaces to serve all students and staff is the best long-term solution for our district.
- Improving safety and security is critical to keeping our school safe.
- Providing additional space to support CTE prepares our students for potential careers.
- Improving our HVAC systems increases indoor air quality.
- Providing additional gym space, restroom improvements, and additional bathrooms will positively impact our students.

# THE COST

Learn about the investment of the \$21.35 million single-question plan.

If the referendum is approved, the district would invest \$21.35 million into key facility improvements.

Like a mortgage payment, bond payments are made up of both principal and interest amounts. If the single-question ballot is approved, the estimated tax impact on a \$100,000 residential home in the district would be approximately \$35 per month starting in 2024, and the bonds would be issued for a period of 20 years.
