OUR CHALLENGES

- Many of our building's heating systems are inadequate, outdated, or past their useful life.
- Our school lacks enough restrooms to support our students.
- We lack a dedicated, secure entrance, and our district office is currently located on the second floor — away from the main entrance area.
- We do not have enough space, and we are currently using spaces not originally designed to support students, particularly for Special Education.
- Several classrooms and other areas do not meet the MDE's recommended guidelines for space and educational adequacy.
- Our shop area is undersized and only provides enough space for woodworking.
- Our gyms are undersized and no longer meet our needs for physical education, athletics, and activities.

WHAT'S ON THE BALLOT?

On Tuesday, November 7, residents of Goodridge Public School will decide on a single-ballot question to invest \$21.35 million into making critical improvements to address our facility and educational needs.


After evaluating several options, the Goodridge School Board feels that the proposed plan balances critical educational and facility needs well. Ultimately, our community will make this decision.



MORE ABOUT THE PLAN

- Expand our educational space to support Career and Technical Education and expose students to various career paths.
- Build a classroom addition to house students in grades 3-6 and provide space to support Special Education and flexible collaboration needs.
- Improve and right-size other educational spaces, including our science classrooms, elementary classrooms, and more.
- Build a full-size gymnasium, including locker rooms, a concessions area, and a new weight room with community access.
- Install a new boiler system, temperature controls, and other system improvements.
- Create a dedicated, secure entrance and relocate the district office near it.
- Build additional restrooms and make additional bathroom improvements.

THE INVESTMENT OF THE PLAN

If approved, the estimated tax impact on a \$100,000 residential home in the district would be approximately \$35 per month starting in 2024. The bonds would be issued for a period of 20 years.

ATTENTION AGRICULTURAL LANDOWNERS!

The State of Minnesota's Ag2School Tax Credit reduces the tax impact for agricultural landowners when it comes to bond referenda like ours.

Ag2School is a 70% tax credit provided to all agricultural property except the house, garage, and one acre surrounding the agricultural homestead.

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MAKE YOUR PLAN TO VOTE



Vote Early by Mail — Friday, September 22 through Monday, November 6:

Residents can vote early by mail by either requesting a ballot online or calling their respective county auditor/treasurer's office (Pennington County or Marshall County). If you hand-deliver your ballot to the county auditor/treasurer's office, you must do so by 3:00 p.m. on Election Day. Mailed ballots must be received by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.



Vote Early in Person — Friday, September 22 through Monday, November 6:

Residents can vote early in person at the Auditor/Treasurer Office in the Government Center (Old Courthouse) in Thief River Falls, Monday through Friday, between 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., except for holidays. There are extended hours from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. on Saturday, November 4, and from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Monday, November 6.



Vote in Person on Election Day — Tuesday, November 7:

Residents can vote in person on Election Day on Tuesday, November 7, from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. at The Goodridge Senior Center, located at 307 Vaughn Main Street East, Goodridge, MN 56725.
